




... what is the ECMI Library?



The ECMI Library is an independent collection of books, journals, and grey literature of more than 3,000 items covering many aspects of minority issues. The highly specialized collection offers public access to a variety of materials in more than twenty languages on inter-ethnic relations, language and cultural diversity issues and ethnic conflict in Europe.



The Library includes a useful reference section and a considerable number of published and unpublished reports, and is especially strong in the area of minority protection with regards to international law. The ECMI Library is also unique in that it includes an ever-growing number of annual reports of Ombudsman offices around the world, which provide insight into the human rights situation in many countries. Current periodical and newspaper subscriptions reflect the multidisciplinary nature of ECMI research, and reference services are provided both in-house and for the general public.



... what does the ECMI Library offer online?

The ECMI Online Public Access Library Catalogue (OPAC) allows researchers to search by title, author, or keyword. Many of our non-English language resources are listed with their titles translated to English, including brief English summaries. Should you not find the materials you need in the catalogue, the Gateway to World Libraries provides direct links to highly useful and relevant library catalogues in order to assist in your efforts. If you require further help, the Ask a Librarian service provides remote assistance, wherever in the world you are! Our librarian usually answers emails within 24 hours. The Enriched Link Database provides a list of carefully monitored, categorized links with information about the contents of each link, including its institutional affiliations and whether or not it includes downloadable texts, relevant statistics, and government documents.

... when and why was the ECMI Library founded?

The ECMI Library was founded in 1997 to provide library and information services in order to meet the educational and research needs of ECMI staff, and to inform the wider public on minority issues. There are very few libraries in the world that deal exclusively with subjects related to minority issues, making this a unique collection in the field. Students and scholars from across the globe use our library resources in their research, and the ECMI Library Guestbook has messages written by visitors from Japan, France, the United Kingdom, Latvia, Belgium, the USA, Germany, Denmark, and Norway, just to name a few.
