Call for Contributions

The *European Yearbook of Minority Issues* provides a critical and timely review of contemporary developments in minority-majority relations in Europe. It combines analysis, commentary and documentation in relation to various minority issues from different scientific perspectives (law, political science, sociology, etc.). The EYMI is a joint editorial product of the European Centre for Minority Issues (Flensburg, Germany), Eurac Research (Bolzano/Bozen, Italy), Åbo Akademi University (Turku, Finland), the Romanian Institute for Research on National Minorities (Cluj-Napoca, Romania), Centre for Social Sciences Institute for Minority Studies (Budapest, Hungary), and University of Glasgow. It has been published with the renowned publishing house Brill.

We are looking for submissions for the 2021 volume. Interested authors are invited to submit an **abstract by 23 January 2022**, based on which selected authors will be invited to write **full contributions by 15 April 2022**. Interested authors are requested to indicate the section they want to contribute to, following the set EYMI structure:

Thematic Articles:

This section contains scholarly articles that study, appraise, critique and reconsider specific issues and trends in minority studies that have emerged or developed further in 2021.

International Developments:

This section features articles that cover relevant minority issues and their developments within the Council of Europe instruments (FCNM, ECRML, ECtHR, ECRI), the OSCE (HCNM, Media), the UN (Rapporteur, Forum, CERD, Committee and Council) and other European instruments in 2021. International developments focus on two major clusters that shall be taken into consideration: participation/citizenship/administration and culture/education/media.

National Developments:

This section contains articles that describe and analyze new initiatives, events, situations, happenings, etc. that have emerged in specific countries in 2021.
